# Asia Pacific Conference on Mosquito and Vector Control (AMV) 2023

The international AMV conference aims to reimagine and optimize vector surveillance and control through innovations and alliances across the public and private

sectors, industry, academia, and civil society. It will be held in Chiang Mai, Thailand on 27-30 November 2023. This four-day conference, with an expected 1,500 participants, is a unique opportunity to bring together a broad spectrum of Asia-Pacific strengthen partners to regional mosquito and vector control capacities, network, and engage with new technologies and approaches to address the rapidly changing landscape for mosquito control in the region, and at the global scale. Jointly planned and hosted by the Royal Thai Ministry of Public Health, the Thai Pest Management Association, and Kasetsart University, the Asia Pacific Conference on Mosquito and Vector Control exemplifies the creative partnerships needed for reimagining mosquito control and engaging innovations for a changed world.

#### IFTM Journal- One Health

The IFTM sponsored journal, *One Health*, has gone from strength to strength since the Federation entered into partnership with Elsevier to publish this journal. The journal has grown from publishing 18 papers in one year to over 150 papers in 2021. The impact factor, forced by the pandemic, grew quickly to 9 in the most recent measure. It is exciting to see that the journal in publishing critical work in key areas and that it encourages support from members of IFTM.

#### International Congress for Tropical Medicine and Malaria (ICTMM) 2028

The bid for the ICTMM2028 is now open. Send your applications to either the IFTM President (m.jones@uq.edu.au) or the Secretary General (sylvie.manguin@ird.fr). Some guidelines for the ICTMM bids are as follows:

- 1.- The bid should be made by a **national society of Tropical Medicine or related science**. The representative of the Society should contact us (the IFTM Board) and inform the board of its intention to present a bid. The IFTM Board will let you know when you may establish the direct personal contact with us and personally present your ideas. The next occasion will be the ICTMM-2024 in Kutching, Malaysia.
- 2.- There is a trend to change continents for the ICTMM organization whenever possible. This means that, considering that the last two ones of 2022 and 2024 were and will be in Asia, logically the continents of Europe, North America, South America and Africa will be preferred for 2028, of course provided that there are good candidates interested.
